Ben Lomond Historic Site

10311 Sudley Manor Drive, Manassas. Famous for its early use as a hospital for injured Union and Confederate soldiers during the Civil War.

Bug Out

September event. A Civil War encampment with a firing demonstration, and period military music, commemorating the Confederate Blockade of the Potomac River.

July/August event. Explore Civil War encampments and enjoy living history presentations, hikes, concerts and more.

Fall Jubilee in Old Town Manassas

October event. Festival with an arts and crafts show, local community performances, educational displays, a kid's activity center, and food and entertainment.

Festival of Freedom

October event. Join other aviation-lovers for this Air Show held at the Manassas Regional Airport.

Freedom Museum

Manassas Regional Airport, 10400 Terminal Road, Manassas. A spectacular array of memorabilia, photography, artifacts, and displays of 20th century wars and conflicts.

Gunston Hall

Gunston Hall was once the center of a 5,500 acre tobacco and corn plantation. Its owner, George Mason IV (1775-1792), was a fourth generation Virginian who became a senior statesman and one of the era's most influential figures. As author of the Virginia Declaration of Rights, Mason was among the first to call for such fundamental American liberties as religious toleration and freedom of the press. Today, Gunston Hall is a National Historic Landmark. Hours of public visitation are 9:30 am to 5:00 pm daily, except Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day.

Manassas Heritage Railway Festival

June event Railway festivals featuring full-sized exhibits, models, railroad memorabilia, rail excursions, and streets filled with food, entertainment and fun.

6511 Sudley Road, Manassas. Site of the First and Second Battles of Manassas, screens "Manassas: End of Innocence," a film about lives affected by the battles.

Merry Old Town Manassas

412 Mill Street, Occoquan. The museum that was once used as a miller's office, is all that remains of the nation's first automated gristmill.

10311 Sudley Manor Drive, Manassas. Inspired by a French garden, this 5,200 sq. foot attraction is one of the largest public gardens devoted to roses in the U.S.

Prince William County Fair

August event The largest county fair in Virginia features concerts, rides, games and exhibits.

18424 Joplin Road, Triangle. A burial site for America's war veterans.

5180 Dale Boulevard, Dale City. One of the largest ice-skating complexes in Northern Virginia featuring one NHL-sized rink and one Olympic-sized rink.

9300 Signal View Drive, Manassas Park. 27,000 square foot aquatics facility

featuring an activity pool with water cannons and a lazy river for inner tube rides.

Signal Hill and Mayfield Fort 703-368-1873

Manassas Museum System. A strategic Confederate observation post during the Civil War that's been reconstructed to educate visitors on "Quaker Guns."

Splashdown Waterpark 703-361-4451

7500 Ben Lomond Park Drive, Manassas. Northern Virginia's largest water park offers two 4-story water slides, a lazy river and Big Kahuna Beach.

Sugarloaf Crafts Festival

September event. Shop for items at the booths of more than 300 juried artisans and crafters. Enjoy demonstrations and delicious food.

Waterworks Waterpark 703-680-7137

5301 Dale Boulevard, Dale City. Features a climbing facility, water sprays and slides, shallow beach area and children's play area

Weems-Botts Museum 703-221-2218

3914 Cameron Street, Dumfries. Guided tours cover the history of Dumfries, the museum and its furnishings, which span the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries.
